Do we have Child Protection and other safety measures in place to ensure the safety of the clubbers, leaders and church? 4. Are older students involved in leadership? 5. Are students understanding the gospel? 6. Do we see a lasting desire for clubbers who have grown up in Awana go on to attend and serve in their adult life?
